

(LIVESTREAMS)* Nashville Predators vs Seattle Kraken Live Stream NHL Hockey Game On 11.03.2026

the **Seattle Kraken** hosted the **Nashville Predators** at Climate Pledge Arena on Tuesday, March 10, 2026. Both teams entered the night fighting to stay relevant in the wild-card race, but it was Seattle that found its rhythm late to secure a vital **3-2 victory**.

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? Match Recap: Resilience at the Sound

First Period: Nashville Strikes Early

The Predators, desperate to snap a four-game road losing streak, came out with a physical forecheck that caught Seattle off guard. **Steven Stamkos**, who has been the offensive engine for Nashville all season, notched his 31st goal of the year just four minutes into the game. Capitalizing on a power-play opportunity, Stamkos unleashed a trademark one-timer from the left circle that beat **Joey Daccord** clean.

Seattle struggled to find their skating legs in the opening twenty minutes, as Nashville's defense, led by **Roman Josi**, effectively clogged the neutral zone and limited the Kraken to just six shots on goal.

Second Period: The Kraken Wake Up

Head coach Lane Lambert's message during the intermission clearly resonated. The Kraken returned for the second period with a visible "compete level" upgrade. The breakthrough came midway through the frame when **Matty Beniers** intercepted a clearing attempt and found **Jordan Eberle** in the slot. Eberle, recently signed to a two-year extension, showed why he remains the captain of this squad, burying a snap shot to tie the game at 1-1.

The momentum shifted entirely toward the home team, as Daccord made two spectacular saves on **Ryan O'Reilly** to keep the score deadlocked heading into the final intermission.

Third Period: The Final Push

The third period was a chaotic back-and-forth affair. Seattle took their first lead of the night early in the period when **Oliver Bjorkstrand** finished a beautiful cross-crease pass from **Vince Dunn**. However, Nashville refused to go quietly. **Filip Forsberg** silenced the Seattle crowd just three minutes later, stripping the puck from a Kraken defenseman and scoring on a breakaway to make it 2-2.

With just under five minutes remaining, the game was decided by Seattle's depth. **Eeli Tolvanen**, facing his former team, found a loose puck during a goal-mouth scramble and poked it past **Juuse Saros**. The Kraken defense held firm during a frantic 6-on-5 advantage for Nashville in the closing minute to secure the two points.

? Top Performers

Seattle Kraken

- **Jordan Eberle:** 1 Goal, 1 Assist. The veteran leader continues to produce in high-pressure moments.
- **Joey Daccord:** 29 saves on 31 shots. His second-period heroics prevented Nashville from running away with the game.
- **Vince Dunn:** 2 Assists, +1 rating. Anchored the top pairing and controlled the transition game.

Nashville Predators

- **Steven Stamkos:** 1 Power-play Goal. Continues to lead the team in scoring despite the mounting losses.
 - **Filip Forsberg:** 1 Goal, 4 Shots. Was the most dangerous player on the ice for Nashville throughout the night.
 - **Juuse Saros:** 24 saves. Kept his team in it despite a lack of offensive support in the second period.
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? Playoff Picture & Analysis

The victory moves the Kraken to **30-24-9** (69 points), keeping them in the thick of the Pacific Division race. For a team that has dealt with recent injuries to key players like **Jaden Schwartz**, winning a tight defensive battle against a desperate opponent is a significant morale booster.

The Predators (**28-28-8**) fall to a .500 record. Despite high-profile veteran additions over the last two seasons, the team is struggling with "working the details," a sentiment echoed by their coaching staff. They remain fourth in the league for goals against, a statistic that haunted them again tonight as they failed to protect two separate leads.

? Injury & Roster Notes

- **Seattle:** Played without **Jaden Schwartz** (upper-body, out indefinitely). Trade deadline acquisition **Bobby McMann** remained out due to pending visa paperwork but is expected to debut on Thursday.
 - **Nashville:** Remained relatively healthy but struggled with fatigue in the third period, playing their third game in five nights.
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? What's Next?

- **Seattle Kraken:** Host the league-leading **Colorado Avalanche** on Thursday, March 12, in a massive test for their defensive structure.
- **Nashville Predators:** Travel home to Bridgestone Arena to host these same **Kraken** in a quick-turnaround rematch on Friday, March 20.
